Request for Quotation (RFQ)

- 1. This RFQ is for the Hiring the Services of Firm for Preparation and Provision of Documentaries for Programme Monitoring & Implementation Unit Punjab Education Sector Reform Programme (PMIU-PESRP) of Punjab Human Capital Investment Project (PHCIP).
- 2. The Islamic Republic of Pakistan has received financing from the World Bank (the Bank) toward the cost of the Punjab Human Capital Investment Project (PHCIP) and intends to apply part of the proceeds toward payments under the contract for the Preparation and Provision of Documentaries.
- 3. The PMIU-PESRP, PHCIP now invites quotations from firms for the non-consulting services (Preparation and Provision of Documentaries), described in Annex 1: Purchaser's Requirements, attached to this RFQ.

Fraud and Corruption

- 4. The Bank requires compliance with the Bank's Anti-Corruption Guidelines and its prevailing sanctions policies and procedures as set forth in the WBG's Sanctions Framework, as set forth in the attachment to the Contract Conditions (Attachment A).
- 5. In further pursuance of this policy, Service Providers shall permit and shall cause their agents (where declared or not), subcontractors, subconsultants, service providers, suppliers, and personnel, to permit the Bank to inspect all accounts, records and other documents relating to the RFQ and contract performance (in the case of award), and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the Bank.

Eligible Services

6. All the Services to be supplied under the Contract and financed by the Bank may have their origin in any country in accordance with Para. 10.

Eligible Service Providers

7. In case the Service Provider is a joint venture (JV), all members shall be jointly and severally liable for the execution of the entire Contract in accordance with the Contract terms. The JV shall nominate a representative who shall have the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the JV during the Request for Quotations process and, in the event the JV is awarded the Contract, during contract execution.

- 8. A Service Provider may have the nationality of any country, subject to the restrictions pursuant to para. 9 and 10 hereinafter. A Service Provider shall be deemed to have the nationality of a country if the Service Provider is constituted, incorporated or registered in, and operates in conformity with, the provisions of the laws of that country, as evidenced by its articles of incorporation (or equivalent documents of constitution or association) and its registration documents, as the case may be. This criterion also shall apply to the determination of the nationality of proposed subcontractors or subconsultants for any part of the Contract.
- 9. Firms and individuals may be ineligible if so indicated in para. 10 below and:
 - (a) as a matter of law or official regulations, the Borrower's country prohibits commercial relations with that country, provided that the Bank is satisfied that such exclusion does not preclude effective competition for the supply of Goods or the contracting of Works or Services required; or
 - (b) by an act of compliance with a decision of the United Nations Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, the Borrower's country prohibits any import of Goods or contracting of Works or Services from that country, or any payments to any country, person, or entity in that country.
- 10. In reference to paras. 6 and 8, for the information of Service Providers, at the present time firms, goods and services from the following countries are excluded from this procurement process:
 - (a) Under para. 6 and 9 (a): none
 - (b) Under para. 6 and 9 (b): none
- 11. A Service Provider that has been sanctioned by the Bank, pursuant to the Bank's Anti-Corruption Guidelines, in accordance with its prevailing sanctions policies and procedures as set forth in the WBG's Sanctions Framework as described in the attachment to the Contract Conditions (Attachment A) paragraph 2.2 d., shall be ineligible to submit Quotations or be awarded or otherwise benefit from a Bank-financed contract, financially or otherwise, during such period of time as the Bank shall have determined. A list of debarred firms and individuals is available on the Bank's external website: http://www.worldbank.org/debarr.
- 12. Service Providers that are state-owned enterprises or institutions in the Employer's country may be eligible to compete and be awarded a Contract(s) only if they can establish, in a manner acceptable to the Bank, that they:
 - (a) are legally and financially autonomous;
 - (b) operate under commercial law; and
 - (c) are not under supervision of the Employer.
- 13. A Service Provider shall not have a conflict of interest. Any Service Provider found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. A Service Provider may be considered to have a conflict of interest for the purpose of this Request for Quotations process, if the Service Provider:

- (a) directly or indirectly controls, is controlled by or is under common control with another Service Provider that submitted a Quotation; or
- (b) receives or has received any direct or indirect subsidy from another Service Provider that submitted a Quotation; or
- (c) has the same legal representative as another Service Provider that submitted a Quotation;
- (d) has a relationship with another Service Provider that submitted a Quotation, directly or through common third parties, that puts it in a position to influence the Quotation of another Service Provider, or influence the decisions of the Employer regarding this Request for Quotations process; or
- (e) or any of its affiliates participated as a consultant in the preparation of the scope the Services, that are the subject of the Request for Quotations process; or
- (f) or any of its affiliates has been hired (or is proposed to be hired) by the Employer or Borrower for implementing the Contract; or
- (g) would be providing Goods, works, or non-consulting services resulting from, or directly related to consulting services for the preparation or implementation of the project specified in this Request for Quotations, that it provided or were provided by any affiliate that directly or indirectly controls, is controlled by, or is under common control with that firm; or
- (h) has a close business or family relationship with a professional staff of the Borrower (or of the project implementing agency, or of a recipient of a part of the loan) who: (i) are directly or indirectly involved in the preparation of the Request for Quotations or specifications and/or the evaluation of Quotations, of the subject Contract; or (ii) would be involved in the implementation or supervision of such Contract unless the conflict stemming from such relationship has been resolved in a manner acceptable to the Bank throughout the Request for Quotations process and execution of the Contract.

Performance Security

14. A Performance Security is not required from the Successful Firm.

Validity of offers

15. QThe offers shall be valid until 90 days from the last date of submission of quotations

Ouoted Price

- 16. Prices shall be quoted in the following manner:
 - (i) the price of the Services quoted shall include sales tax and all other applicable taxes already paid or payable on the Services if the Contract is awarded to the Service Provider; and
 - (ii) the price for inland transportation, insurance, and other local services required to convey the Service Personnel to their final destination (Project Site).
- 17. The Service Provider must quote all the prices in Pak Rupees.

Opening of Quotations

22. Quotations will be opened by the Employer's representatives immediately after the deadline for the submission of Quotations.

Evaluation of Quotations

- 23. Quotations will be evaluated to ensure compliance with the Technical Specifications, Delivery and Completion Schedules and any other requirements of the RFQ.
- 24. Evaluation of the Technical Proposal will include an assessment of the Service Provider's technical capacity to mobilize key equipment and personnel for the contract consistent with its proposal regarding work methods, scheduling, and material sourcing in sufficient detail and fully in accordance with the requirements stipulated in Annex-A, Employer's Requirements.
- 25. The comparison shall be on the basis of final prices (inclusive of all the applicable taxes) plus cost of inland transportation and insurance to place of destination, for Services provided from within the Borrower's country; together with prices for any required installation of equipment, training, commissioning and other services. The evaluation of prices shall not take into account custom duties and other taxes levied on imported goods/services quoted CIP and sales and similar taxes levied in connection with the sale or delivery of goods/services.
- 26. The lowest evaluated price will be determined after correcting any arithmetic errors and other specified adjustments, if any.
- 28. Quotation will be evaluated for the whole package under this RFQ. If a Price Schedule shows items listed but not priced, their prices shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other items. An item not listed in the Price Schedule shall be assumed not included in the Quotation, and provided that the Quotation is substantially responsive, the average of

the item price as quoted by substantially responsive Service Providers will be added to the Quoted Price and the equivalent total price of the Quotation so determined will be used for price comparison.

29. For evaluation and comparison purposes, the currency of the Quotations shall be a single currency, Pak Rupees.

Contract Award

- 31. Subcontractors' experience and resources will not be taken into account in determining the Bidder's compliance with the qualifying criteria, unless otherwise stated in the Qualification Requirements above.
- 32. The Employer shall invite by the quickest means [e-mail] the successful Service Provider/s for any discussion/ negotiation that may be needed to conclude the contract or otherwise for contract signature.
- 33. The Employer shall communicate by the quickest means with the other Service Providers on its contract award decision. An unsuccessful service provider may request clarifications as to why its quotation was not determined to be successful. The Employer will address this request within a reasonable time.
- 34. The Employer shall publish a contract award notice on its website with free access, if available, or in a newspaper of national circulation or UNDB online, within 15 days after award of contract. The information shall include the name of the successful Service Provider/s, the Contract Price, the Contract duration, summary of its scope and the names of the Service Provider/s and their quoted and evaluated prices.

1. Introduction and Background

The Punjab Human Capital Investment Project (PHCIP) aims to achieve qualitative and quantitative improvements in Punjab's Human Capital Index (HCI) and related indicators. The development objective of the Project is to increase access to quality healthcare services, and economic and social inclusion programs, among poor and vulnerable households in selected districts of Punjab.

Social and Economic Inclusion – Economic Inclusion includes promoting the economic inclusion of poor and vulnerable eligible young parents through the provision of technical assistance, income generating assets and training. Social Inclusion includes strengthening selected education initiatives like Early Childhood Education

This assignment pertains to the production of communication products in order to raise awareness about the thematic areas of PHCIP's education component through tools of mass communication which includes television, radio, mobile phones, social media and newspaper.

Documentaries Requirement / Scope:

• Documentary-1: ECCE Training: (2-Minutes)

The Social Inclusion for Education component of PHCIP is focusing on improving quality, equity in access to ECCE (Early Childhood Care & Education) facilities for target beneficiaries in 11 target districts i.e., Muzaffargarh, Bahawalpur, Rajanpur, D.G. Khan, R.Y. Khan, Bhakkar, Mianwali, Bhawalnagar, Lodhran, Layyahh and Khushab. ECCE component of PHCIP includes:

- ❖ Video Shots on Training for capacity building of AEOs, head teachers, teachers and caregivers, developing teaching and learning material to operationalize the ECCE curriculum, Establishing and building capacity for a special Foundational Learning Cell in SED to ensure close monitoring, sustainability and ultimately innovation in early learning interventions.
- **❖** Documentary-2: Social Mobilization to Raise Awareness on ECCE and Relevant Thematic Areas of Social Inclusion for Education: (2-Minutes)

Video Shots on Recognizing the importance of community awareness on ECCE, social mobilization has been made an integral part of sub-component 2.2 of PHCIP; Social Inclusion for Education. The purpose is to run a cohesive community awareness campaign to improve parents and community's understanding on the importance of quality ECCE as a holistic development approach of a child's social, emotional, cognitive and physical needs in order to build a solid and broad foundation for lifelong learning and wellbeing. Social mobilization is also aimed at sensitizing parents, guardians and the community on Enrollment in ECCE, Child Safeguarding, Gender Equity and Gender Based Violence (GBV), Clean and Green Initiatives, Grievance Redressal Mechanism of PHCIP.

❖ For effective social mobilization, it has been planned to deploy social mobilizers within the 11 target districts of the project to conduct community awareness sessions to raise awareness on aforementioned thematic areas. These social mobilizers will conduct community awareness sessions through a school cluster-based approach. The Documentary will be planned and recorded on community awareness activities in the target communities. The media campaign will spread the message creatively and effectively among the target audiences. The production and release of all the communication products, as part of this assignment, must be appropriate for the consumption of the target audience of PHCIP which comprises low-literacy population groups.

• Documentary-3: Overall PHCIP Education Component Intervention (2-Minutes)

- ❖ Government of Punjab has envisaged the Punjab Human Capital Investment Project (PHCIP) to improve the human capital outcomes of the poor and vulnerable households in the 11 target districts i.e., Muzaffargarh, Bahawalpur, Rajanpur, D.G. Khan, R.Y. Khan, Bhakkar, Mianwali, Bhawalnagar, Lodhran, Layyahh and Khushab.
- ❖ The Project goal is to achieve qualitative and quantitative improvements in Punjab's HCI and related indicators. The Project Development Objective is to "increase the utilization of quality health services, and economic and social inclusion programs, among poor and vulnerable households in select districts in Punjab".
- The Economic Inclusion is aimed at promoting the economic inclusion (EI) of poor and vulnerable eligible young parents through the provision of technical assistance, goods, and training, including and not limited to (a) Labor Market Readiness (LMR) training; (b) Livelihood Support Grants or Productive Assets; and (c) intensive coaching aimed at improving adaptive productive behaviour.

- i). Three (03) documentaries with 2-minutes duration each on the defined areas (ECCE, Social Mobilization & PHCIP Project) will be produced. The media firm / agency will provide different time duration version cuts for finalized documentary (45-Sec., 90-Sec. 120-Sec) for the consumption purpose / release on different platforms (electronic / digital) etc.
- ii). The firm will provide different versions of the documentary (English Subtitles).
- iii). The VO of the documentary will be required in English, urdu and Saraiki / local languages.
- iv). The radio messages will be extracted from each documentary.
- v). Still Slots captured during the documentary shoot will be property of PHCIP / handed over to Client / PHCIP.
- ii) More than 80% Content of each video short will be live / originally recorded by the firm Instead of existing content material.
- iii). The firm will work on the creative design, production of the Video Product / Documentary and will also monitor optimum dissemination of the media (communication products).
- iv). The firm will develop a documentary on products based on the Branding and Visibility Guidelines of PHCIP, and will carve out content for the key messages from the content developed for ECCE-Training and Social Mobilization campaign. Communication products developed as part of this assignment will be aimed at complementing the on-ground social mobilization activities. Promoting Clean and Green Initiatives among children and communities

3. Duration of the Assignment

The assignment will be implemented over a period of three month.

Health and safety 29.1 The Service Provider shall comply, and shall require its obligations Subcontractors if any to comply, with all applicable health and safety regulations, laws, guidelines, and any other requirement stated in the Scope of Services. 30. Patent Indemnity The Service Provider shall, subject to the Employer's compliance with CC 30.2, indemnify and hold harmless the Employer and its employees and officers from and against any and all suits, actions or administrative proceedings, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, and expenses of any nature, including attorney's fees and expenses, which the Employer may suffer as a result of any infringement or alleged infringement of any patent, utility model, registered design, trademark, copyright, or other intellectual property right registered or otherwise existing at the date of the Contract by reason of the installation of the Goods by the Service Provider or the provision of Services Such indemnity shall not cover any use of the Goods or any part thereof other than for the purpose indicated by or to be reasonably inferred from the Contract, neither any infringement resulting from the use of the Goods or any part thereof, or any products produced thereby in association or combination with any other equipment, plant, or materials not supplied by the Service Provider, pursuant to the Contract. 30.1 If any proceedings are brought or any claim is made against the Employer arising out of the matters referred above, the Employer shall promptly give the Service Provider a notice thereof, and the Service Provider may at its own expense and in the Employer's name conduct such proceedings or claim and any negotiations for the settlement of any such proceedings or claim. 30.2 If the Service Provider fails to notify the Employer within twenty-eight (28) days after receipt of such notice that it intends

- to conduct any such proceedings or claim, then the Employer shall be free to conduct the same on its own behalf.
- 30.3 The Employer shall, at the Service Provider's request, afford all available assistance to the Service Provider in conducting such proceedings or claim, and shall be reimbursed by the Service Provider for all reasonable expenses incurred in so doing.
- 30.4 The Employer shall indemnify and hold harmless the Service Provider and its employees, officers, and Subcontractors from and against any and all suits, actions or administrative proceedings, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, and expenses of any nature, including attorney's fees and expenses, which the Service Provider may suffer as a result of any infringement or alleged infringement of any patent, utility model, registered design, trademark, copyright, or other intellectual property right registered or otherwise existing at the date of the Contract arising out of or in connection with any design, data, drawing, specification, or other documents or materials provided or designed by or on behalf of the Employer.

31. Change Orders and Contract Amendments

- 31.1 The Employer may at any time order the Service Provider through notice in accordance CC 4.1, to make changes within the general scope of the Contract in any one or more of the following:
 - (a) Services to be provided by the Service Provider;
 - (b) drawings, designs, or specifications, where Goods to be furnished under the Contract are to be specifically manufactured for the Employer;
 - (c) the method of shipment or packing;
 - (d) changes in quantities of Services to be supplied within the range specified herewith.
 - (e) the place of delivery;
 - (f) any test and/or inspection not required by the Contract but deemed necessary, pursuant to CC 17.5; and
- 31.2 If any such change causes an increase or decrease in the cost of, or the time required for, the Service Provider's performance of any provisions under the Contract, an equitable adjustment shall be made in the Contract Price or in the Delivery/Completion Schedule, or both, and the Contract shall accordingly be amended. Any claims by the Service Provider for adjustment under this Clause must be asserted within twenty-eight (28) days from the date of the Service Provider's receipt of the Employer's change order.

	 31.3 Prices to be charged by the Service Provider for any Related Services that might be needed but which were not included in the Contract shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the Service Provider for similar services. 31.4 Subject to the above, no variation in or modification of the terms of the Contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties.
32. Attachment A to the Conditions of Contract Fraud and Corruption

(Text in this Appendix shall not be modified)

1. Purpose

1.1 The Bank's Anti-Corruption Guidelines and this annex apply with respect to procurement under Bank Investment Project Financing operations.

2. Requirements

2.1 The Bank requires that Borrowers (including beneficiaries of Bank financing); bidders (applicants/proposers), consultants, contractors and Service Providers; any sub-contractors, sub-consultants, service providers or Service Providers; any agents (whether declared or not); and any of their personnel, observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement process, selection and contract execution of Bank-financed contracts, and refrain from Fraud and Corruption.

2.2 To this end, the Bank:

- a. Defines, for the purposes of this provision, the terms set forth below as follows:
 - i. "corrupt practice" is the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence improperly the actions of another party;
 - ii. "fraudulent practice" is any act or omission, including misrepresentation, that knowingly or recklessly misleads, or attempts to mislead, a party to obtain financial or other benefit or to avoid an obligation;
 - iii. "collusive practice" is an arrangement between two or more parties designed to achieve an improper purpose, including to influence improperly the actions of another party;
 - iv. "coercive practice" is impairing or harming, or threatening to impair or harm, directly or indirectly, any party or the property of the party to influence improperly the actions of a party;
 - v. "obstructive practice" is:
 - (a) deliberately destroying, falsifying, altering, or concealing of evidence material to the investigation or making false statements to investigators in order to materially impede a Bank investigation into allegations of a corrupt, fraudulent, coercive, or collusive practice; and/or threatening, harassing, or intimidating any party to prevent it from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the investigation or from pursuing the investigation; or
 - (b) acts intended to materially impede the exercise of the Bank's inspection and audit rights provided for under paragraph 2.2 e. below.

- b. Rejects a proposal for award if the Bank determines that the firm or individual recommended for award, any of its personnel, or its agents, or its sub-consultants, sub-contractors, service providers, Service Providers and/ or their employees, has, directly or indirectly, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices in competing for the contract in question;
- c. In addition to the legal remedies set out in the relevant Legal Agreement, may take other appropriate actions, including declaring misprocurement, if the Bank determines at any time that representatives of the Borrower or of a recipient of any part of the proceeds of the loan engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices during the procurement process, selection and/or execution of the contract in question, without the Borrower having taken timely and appropriate action satisfactory to the Bank to address such practices when they occur, including by failing to inform the Bank in a timely manner at the time they knew of the practices;
- d. Pursuant to the Bank's Anti- Corruption Guidelines and in accordance with the Bank's prevailing sanctions policies and procedures, may sanction a firm or individual, either indefinitely or for a stated period of time, including by publicly declaring such firm or individual ineligible (i) to be awarded or otherwise benefit from a Bank-financed contract, financially or in any other manner; (ii) to be a nominated sub-contractor, consultant, manufacturer or Service Provider, or service provider of an otherwise eligible firm being awarded a Bank-financed contract; and (iii) to receive the proceeds of any loan made by the Bank or otherwise to participate further in the preparation or implementation of any Bank-financed project;
- e. Requires that a clause be included in bidding/request for proposals documents and in contracts financed by a Bank loan, requiring (i) bidders (applicants/proposers), consultants, contractors, and Service Providers, and their sub-contractors, sub-consultants, service providers, Service Providers, agents personnel, permit the Bank to inspect³ all accounts, records and other documents relating to the procurement process, selection and/or contract execution, and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the Bank.

For the avoidance of doubt, a sanctioned party's ineligibility to be awarded a contract shall include, without limitation, (i) applying for pre-qualification, expressing interest in a consultancy, and bidding, either directly or as a nominated subcontractor, nominated consultant, nominated manufacturer or supplier, or nominated service provider, in respect of such contract, and (ii) entering into an addendum or amendment introducing a material modification to any existing contract.

A nominated sub-contractor, nominated consultant, nominated manufacturer or supplier, or nominated service provider (different names are used depending on the particular bidding document) is one which has been: (i) included by the bidder in its pre-qualification application or bid because it brings specific and critical experience and know-how that allow the bidder to meet the qualification requirements for the particular bid; or (ii) appointed by the Borrower.

Inspections in this context usually are investigative (i.e., forensic) in nature.
